

Best Practices: Child Community Outreach

Purpose

Provide an interactive outreach within the church community that facilitates an opportunity to build relationships and draw people from the local community into the church.

Pray

Pray for unity amongst the US and international leaders. Pray for soft hearts while you train, prepare for and implement a child community outreach.

Plan

- Design activity stations: Create your own activities or as WO for suggestions.
 - Be sensitive that each activity needs to be replicable by the international church for the future.
 - Be purposeful to find Scripture that can be incorporated into the event. (i.e. create a pupper show that tells a meaningful Bible story.)
- Communicate the activity stations to the international church and ask if they will be well received.
- Ask World Orphans international staff to work with the international church to form a team of internationals to co-lead activities (when possible).
 - Ideally, the international leaders will have adequate English skills to understand and communicate the basics of each activity.
- Plan to have one interpreter and/or international leader per activity. Add cost to the budget.
- Determine the supplies needed for each activity. Be prepared to leave the supplies for the international church to use for future events.
 - Consider whether it is better to purchase supplies in the US or in the host country.
 - Buy more supplies than needed in case there are more children than anticipated.
 - Be aware that supplies may break and need to be replaced.
- Practice running the outreach at home before the trip. Train each team member thoroughly.
 - Designate one US team member to visit with on-lookers (moms and other adults) to engage them and help them feel welcomed at the church.

Participate

- Set-up activity stations alongside the international leaders about an hour before the outreach.
 - Set-up chairs where on-lookers can watch and converse throughout the event.
 - Explain the activity stations to international leaders/interpreters so that they can explain and lead the activities for the kids.
- Gather all team leaders and pray and start the event with prayer.
- Facilitate activities.
 - Pass the torch to the international leaders as much as possible. Encourage them to lead the
 activities so that the US team members can function in a supportive role and ultimately the
 church shines.
 - o Be sensitive and accommodate children with special needs or physical limitations.
- Bring closure to the event by focusing attention on the international church and the Gospel.
- Debrief with the international leaders and US team. Take notes to share with future teams and World Orphans in the post-trip debrief.
 - Ask questions like: What went well? What was challenging? What was impacting? Do you have a story from the day? What can we improve?

Post-Trip: Communicate post-event debriefing notes with World Orphans.
